



Bulldogs use 35-point first quarter to rout Royals

FAIRFIELD — Ryan Vaughan and Timothy Plowman had a hand in the Vacaville High football team's first four touchdowns – all part of 35-point first quarter – as the Bulldogs rolled past Armijo 49-0 at Brownlee Field, Friday night.

Vacaville improved to 5-2 overall and 2-0 in the Monticello Empire League, upping its record to 64-29-10 in Solano County's oldest continuous rivalry. The Royals fell to 1-6 and 0-2.

Vaughan opened the scoring with a 30-yard touchdown pass to Plowman with 10:17 to go in the first quarter as Gracie Caulfield booted the first of seven conversions.

Vaughan then ran for a 76-yard touchdown, Plowman returned an interception for a score, and Vaughan hit Cameron Faucher for an 11-yard TD to make it 28-0.

Yet the Bulldogs weren't done in the first quarter as Amani Holliday added a 7-yard touchdown run.

Vacaville concluded the scoring with two second-quarter TDs, a 25-yard pass from Vaughan to Anthony Wiley and a 5-yard run by Finn Chapman.

Vaughan finished the night 7-of-9 for 128 yards and three TDs through the air with 110 yards and one TD rushing on four carries.

Holiday added 65 yards on six carries and Blake Espino, who rushed for more than 1,000 yards for Armijo as a sophomore in 2019, gaining 45 yards on three carries.

Faucher had two catches for 52 yards and Wiley two catches for 32 yards.

For Armijo, Eddie Concepcion was 10-of-19 for 129 yards with two interceptions. Keshawn Williams was the leading rusher with 23 yards on four carries, while Guy Fortson caught three passes for five yards, Dameion Regalado and Kaiba Washington each caught two passes for 45 and 31 yards, respectively, and Cesar Torres caught one pass for 40 yards.

The Bulldogs host Vanden in a showdown for first place in the MEL on Friday, while Armijo entertains Will C. Wood for homecoming.
