



## Vaca to tough for Armijo

**October 13, 2007** - Bad news for the rest of the Monticello Empire League – Terrance Dailey has been told to be tougher.

Vacaville High School's star running back rushed for a career-high 243 yards and five touchdowns ... in the first half ... as the Bulldogs opened Monticello Empire League with a 49-7 pasting of Armijo Friday night at Brownlee Field.

"My running back coach said I wasn't running hard enough, so all this week I focused on running with more power than elusiveness," said Dailey, who went over 1,000 yards rushing for the season and pushed his career rushing touchdown total to 56, one behind Evan Williams for the Bulldogs' career mark. "I was running harder ... and I had great blocking."

Dailey scored on runs of 29, 19, three, 42 and 89 yards as Vacaville scored on its first five drives and led 35-0 at halftime.

Markel Williams added touchdown runs of 24 and 39 yards in the second half for the Bulldogs, who improved to 6-0 overall and won their 17th straight game dating back to last year.

Vacaville finished with 459 of its 519 yards on the ground as 11 different players carried the ball.

On defense, Vacaville limited the host Indians to 63 total yards in the first half as Ryan Prescott and Taylor Goodson led a group that again tried to be as stingy.

The Bulldogs were excited, if not satisfied.

"Overall, I think we did pretty well, but I know we can execute a little better," Prescott said. "It means everything for us to shut them down. It means we're doing our job."

Tim Stewart added Armijo's only touchdown on a 20-yard run with 19 seconds left in the third quarter. Stewart finished with 105 of the Indians' 111 rushing yards.
