



# Vacaville High School football team races to 69-0 victory over Armijo

Hudson Buck and the Vacaville High School football team made the most of a short night.

Buck scored three touchdowns as the Bulldogs blasted shorthanded Armijo 69-0 on Friday night at Tom Zunino Stadium.

Buck scored untouched on a 29-yard pass play from Tim Irwin, and then returned an interception 29 yards for another score as the Bulldogs led 28-0 with 7:33 still left in the first quarter.

“Just take care of business ... that’s what ”Pop” (head coach Mike Papadopoulos) was telling us all week,” Buck said. “On the interception, they ran that play and Smitty (assistant coach Ryan Smith) yelled at me to cut under it. They ran the same play again and I did.”

Buck added his third score on a 25-yard sweep with 32 seconds in the first quarter, giving the Bulldogs a school-record 42 points in the period.

LaRyan King added a 27-yard interception return for a touchdown, and was one of five Vacaville players to pick off passes.

Irwin had three touchdown passes, completing seven of nine passes for 148 yards in the first quarter alone. Two of the TD tosses went to C.J. Jacobe.

Curtis Goins, Ross Lopez, Marwin Wilson and Nick Berumen also scored rushing touchdowns, and Reed White kicked nine extra points.

Eleven different Bulldogs carried the ball, and Quincy Forte, Jessie Kassis and Berumen joined Buck and King with interceptions.

The Bulldogs improved to 7-1 overall, 3-0 in Monticello Empire League play.

Armijo, which has just 23 players on its roster and suited up only 21 Friday night, fell to 0-8 and 0-3.

“Fortunately, both teams came out of this healthy,” Papadopoulos said. “It’s tough on everyone, but you have to commend Armijo for coming out and battling.”

Vacaville plays Vintage in Napa next week.
