



Vacaville rips Laguna Creek

September 15, 2007 - Josh Kaddu got a gift, and the Vacaville High's football team got a breather.

Kaddu recorded perhaps his easiest interception ever and returned it 25 yards for a touchdown, one of three Bulldog touchdowns in a 2-minute span that turned a close game into a 36-6 rout over Laguna Creek Friday night at Elk Grove High.

The Bulldogs (2-0 overall) never trailed after the first quarter, but held on to a tenuous 16-6 lead early in the third quarter before Terrance Dailey streaked down the right sideline 25 yards for a score with 8:23 left.

One play later, three Bulldogs crushed Laguna Creek quarterback Wyatt Jiru as he released a pass that floated in the air and was snatched by Kaddu, who raced untouched to another touchdown.

"I was locked on the tight end, and he stayed in to block," Kaddu explained. "The ball got tipped, and it just fell into my hands. It came out of the sky."

Kaddu wasn't done. After three Laguna Creek plays and a penalty netted minus-12 yards, he rushed in and blocked Jiru's punt in the Cardinals' end zone.

Dailey fell on the ball for his third touchdown of the game and seventh in two weeks.

The Cardinals finished with 63 yards of offense in the second half, 44 of which came on their first snap. In one stretch, Laguna Creek netted just one yard on 15 plays, punting five times.

"We were just great on defense ... and special teams," Vacaville head coach Mike Papadopoulos said. "The offense took a while to get going, so we've got some things to work on."

Vacaville did almost nothing on offense until Dailey burst up the middle for 80 yards and a touchdown with six seconds left in the first quarter.

Dailey had 206 yards rushing on 17 carries.

Johnny Feaster added a 2-yard scoring run in the second period, and Spencer Lukehart hit a 26-yard field goal late in the third quarter.
