



## **Seven Vacaville High School football players score TDs in 76-21 road win**

There was no running clock this week to thwart Vacaville High School's football team and the Bulldogs scored in bunches for a 76-21 win over Vintage at Napa Memorial Stadium.

Armijo called on the running clock last week in the second quarter. Vintage would have none of it and kept up the fight. Vacaville, meanwhile, continually changed personnel and found 11 different ways to score.

The Bulldogs rushed for 481 yards and went to the air for another 130 for 611 yards of total offense. Seven different Bulldogs scored.

"We feel pretty good," Vacaville's Curtis Goins said. "It was fun. We did exactly what we wanted to do."

Vacaville clinched at least a share of the Monticello Empire League title going into next Friday night's Black and Blue Bowl against Will C. Wood. The Bulldogs are 4-0 in MEL play and 8-1 overall.

Goins opened the game with an 85-yard kickoff return for a touchdown. He also caught a 39-yard touchdown pass from Tyler Irwin, had a 51-yard touchdown run and intercepted a pass.

Melvin Mason rushed nine times for 183 yards with touchdown runs of 64, 1 and 43 yards.

His 64-yard touchdown run came right after Goins' TD as the Bulldogs scored on first two times they touched the ball.

Quincy Forte had a 4-yard touchdown run, Hudson Buck added a

29-yarder, Jessie Kassis dashed 55 yards for a score and Marwin Wilson got into the act with a 10-yard touchdown run.

The most usual score came when Johnny Schupp picked up a fumble on defense and raced 40 yards for a score.

Vacaville kicker Reed White was 10-for-10 on extra points. The Bulldogs missed one 2-point conversion pass.

“Our kids played really well,” Vacaville head coach Mike Papadopoulos said. “There was a momentum shift in a couple of spots and they had a hard time stopping what we were doing.”

Vintage managed 163 yards in the air and 137 on the ground. Quarterback Dylan Duprez connected with receiver Jeff Carruth for touchdown passes of 18 and 5 yards. Running back Zach Zuniga also had a 61-yard run.
